Dance Complex has its home in Central Square in Cambridge, MA and produces more than 100 concerts a year. This community of dancers is reflective of its locale, attracting people from all corners of the world. That diversity is reflected in its artists, classes, and performances. www.dancecomplex.org.

Ensemble Lyzze is a vocal women's ensemble consisting of four singers and a pianist, specializing in musical works that are often unknown or under-played, as well as in new works written especially for them. Known for their remarkable sound and imaginative programming, Ensemble Lyrae performs regularly in the Boston area at venues large and small.

Vocalist New MacLin is a recent graduate of Brandeis University where she sang the national anthem at their graduation ceremony. She also sang the anthem to kick off a 2017 Patriots playoff game. She is equally comfortable with gospel and musical theater repertoire and was featured in a production of "The Last Five Years" with the Gloucester Stage Company. At Brandeis University Ms. Macklin is a Breakthrough Collaborative alumnae and teaching fellow alumnae; the first Black woman in the history of the university to serve as president of Brandeis University's Student Government; one of four women of color to negotiate during a 12-day crisis occupation for the rights of 100 students of color that resulted in a thirteen-page diversity and inclusion implementation plan for Brandeis University; serves on the board of the Black Alumni Network at Hopkins School where Ms. Macklin holds the position of Vice Chair; and is also New Leader's Council-Boston alumnae where she serves on the board as the Co-Chair of Admissions. She currently works as the Legislative Aide to a member of the Massachusetts House of Representatives.

Operatic soprano Jannifer Sgroe recently made her Jordan Hall debut. She has also appeared with the Hartford Opera Theater in a world premiere one-woman opera. In recital she specializes in contemporary American opera and art song

along with Baroque and Classical repertoire. Sgroe has sung throughout the US as well as at festivals in Finland, England, and Austria.

Soprano Emily Tweedy has been hailed as "a delight", "warm and inviting", and Opera Today praised her voice for its "genuine beauty and control". In the 2016-2017 season she made her role debut as Nannetta in Falstaff as well as covering the role of Zémire in Zémire et Azor with Opera Saratoga. Recent seasons have included appearances with Des Moines Metro Opera and Opera Theatre of Saint Louis. Engagements for the 2017-2018 season include Haydn's The Creation with Burnt Hills Oratorio Society, appearances with American Lyric Theater, Handel's Messiah with Boston's Eureka Ensemble, and appearances with Nashville Opera in Hercules vs. Vampires and Susannah. A Georgia native, Miss Tweedy earned the degree Master of Music at the New England Conservatory.

Soprano is the Media is a 2017 graduate of Milton High School. This past June, Katherine made her solo debut with the Boston Pops under the baton of Keith Lockhart at Symphony Hall after winning the Fidelity Investments Young Artists Competition. Over the past two summers, she has worked as an intern with Opera Maine, serving as the Coordinator for the Opera Maine Teens Program and singing in the choruses of CARMEN and LA TRAVIATA. In February of last year, Katherine made her Lincoln Center solo debut after being selected for the Metropolitan Opera High School Singers Intensive. Katherine is excited to be continuing her musical studies at Fredonia School of Music in the fall, pursuing degrees in both Voice Performance and Music Education.

is an active vocal coach, collaborative pianist, and conductor, and is currently in his twenty-seventh year on the opera faculty at New England Conservatory. Also, he has conducted for outreach tours with the Boston Lyric Opera (more than 200 performances for school children) and is a former music director for Opera Providence. He has served as conductor/pianist for over 180 operatic productions with 33 companies, including Opera Theatre of St. Louis, Boston Lyric Opera, Boston Symphony Orchestra, Wolf Trap Opera, Central City Opera, and Opera Maine. In workshops and rehearsals he assisted with the Pulitzer Prize-winning opera MADAME WHITE SNAKE for productions in Boston and Taiwan. He is the music director/organist at historic First Parish Church in Milton, MA. In Boston he has performed with Emmanuel Music (where he played for a decade of weekly Bach cantatas), the Handel and Haydn Society, and the Commonwealth Shakespeare Company, among others.

A native of Des Moines, Iowa, Timothy received his Bachelor of Music from Drake University and a Master of Music from the University of Southern California, where he studied collaborative piano with Gwendolyn Koldofsky.
